### **Comments**

The CRMCHPS works closely with the Colorado State University (CSU) Student Branch in sharing speakers (on different topics) between the CRMC evening dinner meeting and the daytime CSU HP Program guest lecture series. Dr. Thomas E. Johnson, CSU Student Branch Advisor is an energizing force for both the Branch and Chapter. The CRMC meets jointly with the NIOSH Mountain and Plains Education and Research Center (MAP/ERC). The NIOSH MAP/ERC are an affiliate member and provide funding which allows us to admit student chapter members at no cost. In 2017 our chapter participated, judged and provided awards for the MAP/ERC Research Day in March 2017. Monthly chapter meetings are held primarily at the Anschutz Medical Campus in Aurora, CO, but we aim to hold at least one meeting at the CSU campus and CU Boulder campus each year. Meetings feature a light dinner and social hour before each evening meeting (at no cost to the students), followed by technical presentations and discussion with prominent Health Physics professionals. We regularly invite local NRRPT registrants and ANS members, as well as the Colorado School of Mines and the University of Colorado Anschutz campus community to attend our meetings. As is traditional for our Chapter, the Spring Annual technical meeting was held at the Student Center of CSU in Fort Collins. The focus of the Spring technical meeting is research presentations by the CSU Health Physics students. This year we also invited student speakers and

other distinguished guests from Hiroshima University. HPS President-elect Eric Abelquist was the keynote speaker of the day, following a social hour and dinner.
