

ORISE Releases Salary Information for Health Physicists

Health physicists have had a five to six percent increase in salaries since last year according to a recent survey. (Compare to survey in *Newsletter*, November 1998, page 18.) From a survey of personnel working as health physicists and nuclear engineers for June 1999, the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education (ORISE) reports salary information for personnel at the B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. levels with zero, one, three, four to seven, and eight to ten years of professional work experience.

Information is provided for utilities and nonutilities.

Nonutilities include private sector organizations and U.S. Department of Energy contractor-operated facilities. Government agencies, the military, academic organizations, and medical facilities are excluded.
