Joel Lubenau received a Bachelor of Civil Engineering degree in 1961 from The Cooper Union and was a U.S. Public Health Service Fellow at Rutgers University's Nuclear Science Center and the Brookhaven National Laboratory receiving a MS in Radiological Health in 1965.

He served two tours of duty as a commissioned officer in the U.S. Public Health Service; during his second tour, Commander Lubenau directed the start-up of the Executive Secretary of Nationwide Evaluation of X-ray Trends (NEXT) program. Between tours, he was chief of the Division of Radiation Control in Pennsylvania's Bureau of Radiation Protection. Later, he joined the AEC and managed the Commission's Agreement State Program. From 1992 to 1999, he served as Technical Assistant to NRC Commissioners E. Gail de Planque and Greta Joy Dicus, retiring from government service in 1999.

An author of over 50 publications, Joel is an Associate Editor of *Operational Radiation Safety*, an adjunct member of National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements, and a Fellow Member of the Health Physics Society (Class of 2004). Now a consultant, he is a Senior Advisor on radiological terrorism issues for the Monterey Institute's Center for Nonproliferation Studies.
