Dade Moeller was born and reared in Florida. After serving in the US Navy in World War II, he attended Georgia Institute of Technology where he received a BS in civil engineering (1947) and an MS in environmental engineering (1948). He later (1957) received a PhD in nuclear engineering from North Carolina State University. From 1948 – 1966, he served as a commissioned officer in the US Public Health Service (USPHS). During that time, he was stationed at the Los Alamos and Oak Ridge National Laboratories, directed the USPHS Radiological Health Training Program in Cincinnati, Ohio, and the Northeastern Radiological Health Laboratory in Winchester, Massachusetts. From 1966 – 1993, he served as Chair of the Department of Environmental Health Sciences and later as Associate Dean for Continuing Education at the Harvard School of Public Health. Upon retiring in 1993, he cofounded with his son, Matthew, Dade Moeller & Associates, which provides environmental health consulting services to government agencies, private industry, and legal organizations. He provided support to the National Academy of Sciences BEIR I and BEIR III Committees and served on the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements and on Committee 4 of the International Commission on Radiological Protection. He also chaired the American Board of Health Physics and was President of the Health Physics Society. He currently chairs the Science & Technology Review Panel, Office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management, US Department of Energy. His primary research activities are related to air cleaning systems for nuclear power plants and the control of indoor airborne radon decay products. He is the author of a widely used textbook, *Environmental Health*, now in its third edition.
